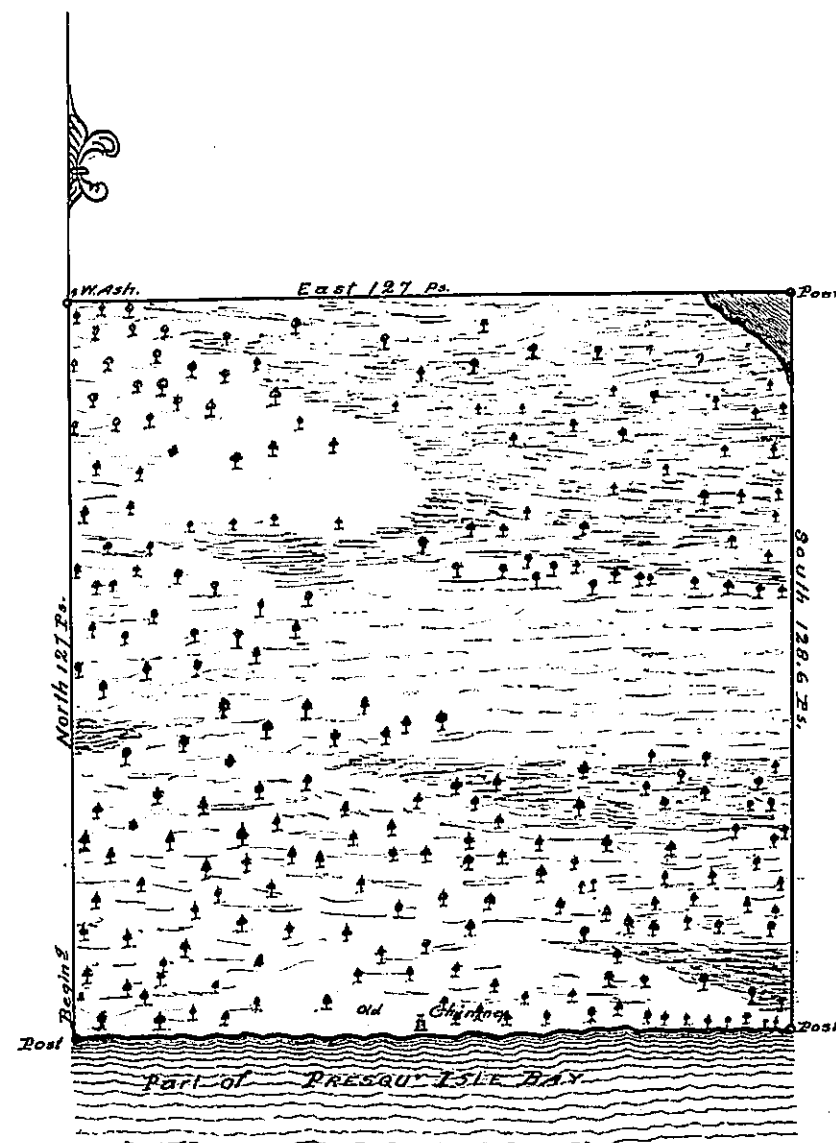

A DRAUGHT of a survey of a Lot ground on the Peninsula, commonly called, Presqu' Isle, beginning at a red Cedar post standing on the bank of the Bay, thence North one hundred and twenty seven perches to a white ash corner thence East one hundred and twenty seven perches to a post thence South ~~One hundred & twenty~~ One hundred & twenty eight perches and six tenths of a perch to a red Cedar post, thence by the Bay the following courses Vixⁿ West seventy two perches to a post, and North eighty nine Degrees and an half West, fifty six perches to the place of Beginning, Containing One hundred acres of Land for the use of the United States, Surveyed agreeably to an act of the Legislature of the State of Pennsylvania, bearing date the 18th day of April 1795.
