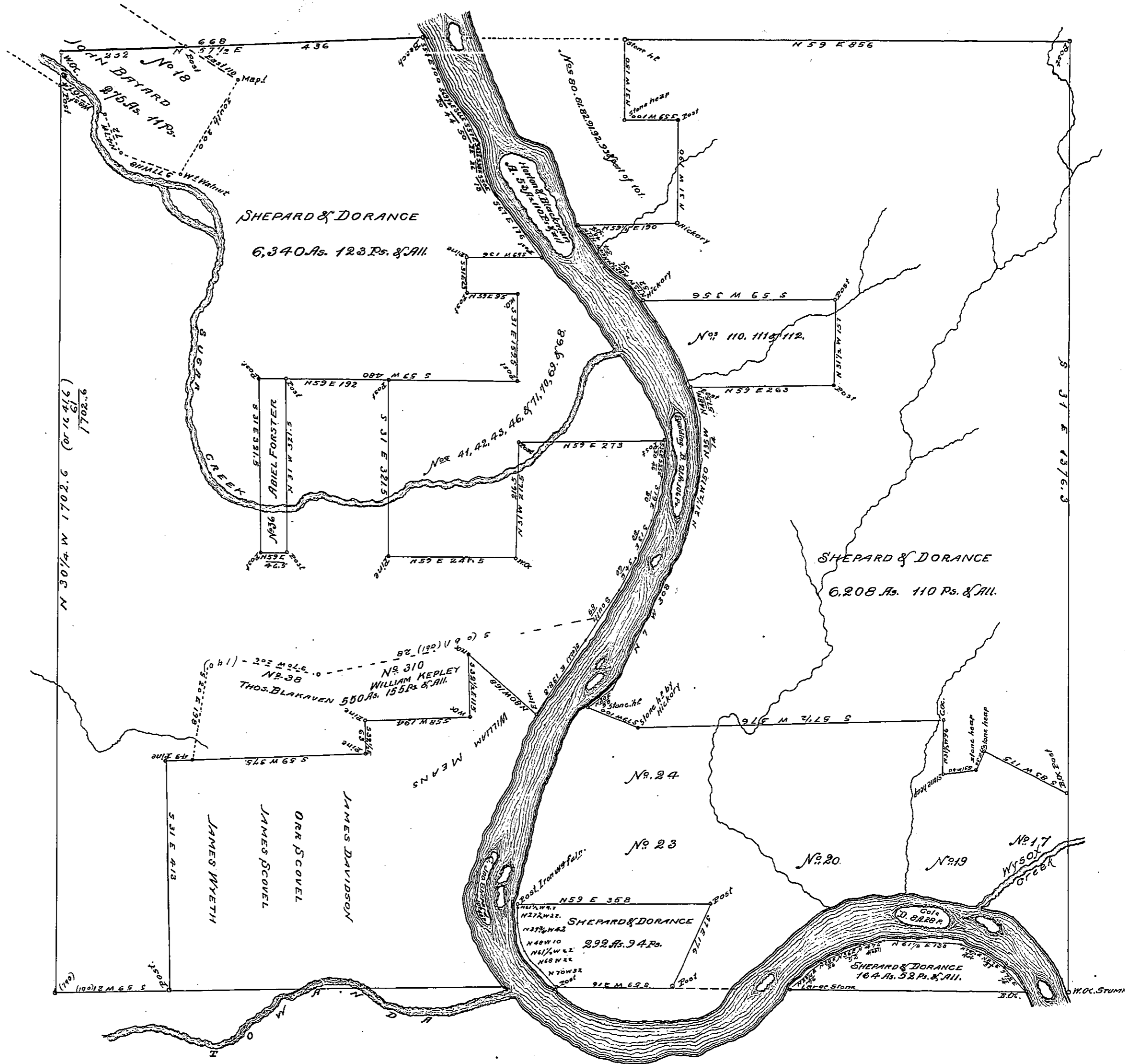

In pursuance of a Resolution of the House of Representatives of the State of Pennsylvania of the 13th of March 1815, a decree of the Supreme Court of the 10th of April 1815 & the Commission of the Surveyor General thereon founded to us directed. Resurveyed the above described lands, certified to Shepard & Dorrance situate in the Township of Claverack and County of Bradford, and find the whole amount to be Thirteen thousand & Six acres, fifty nine perches & allowance of 6 p. c. Island A. is claimed by Rich^d Hartland, Franklin Blackman & contains 53 Acs. 110 Ps. strict measure, which we value at Ten Dollars pr acre. B. is claimed by Henry Spalding & contains 21 Acs. 106 Ps. strict measure valued at Twelve Dollars pr. Acs. C. is claimed by John Shepard & contains 10 Acs. 40 Ps. which we value at 6th pr. D. is claimed by Solomon Cole & contains 8 Acs. 28 Ps. which we value at 8th pr. There are two other small Islands nearly opposite William Meanses Certificate claimed by him, which contains about 2 Acs. each which we value at 8th pr. — We have bounded our Survey by the same line which governed that of the Commissioners finding the allotments under the Susquehanna bounded by the same limits, though we could find no trees blocking more than 23 years — In addition to the duties assigned we have taken the liberty of exhibiting (by dotted lines) parts of three tracts of land which Shepard & Dorrance have released to owners under Pennsylvania titles, which together make 826 Acs. 6 Ps. and if deducted will leave Twelve thousand, one hundred and Eighty acres 53 pr. & all. Witness our hands this 26th day of May 1815.
