



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date the — Day of — Anno Dom — I have Survey'd and Lay'd out unto David Priest in the Township of Pennaborough in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna River four hundred acres of land wth allowance of Six plant Beginning at the Mouth of Yellow-Breech Creek Thence down Susquehanna River one hundred & seventy one pches to a Chestnut Tree by the sd. river Thence South Twenty degrees westerly by land of John Harris four hundred and two pches to a white oak Thence North fifty degrees westerly, one hundred pches to a white oak Thence north Twenty degrees westerly Thirty four pches. Thence north forty One degrees west-erly One hundred and Eighty pches a white oak by the sd. Creek Thence down the same traversing the severall courses thereof near about Three hundred & Twenty pches to the sd. river.
