



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries of
 bearing Date the fourteenth Day of February anno D.
 1757. I have surveyed and laid out unto Thomas Fulton
 in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster
 on the west side Susquehanna River Three hundred
 Acres of Land with Allowance of 6 Percent
 Beginning at a Post in the Line of Robert Mills's Land
 then by the same Land and Land of Patrick Casson's
 North Seventy Degrees Westerly one hundred and seven-
 ty Pches to a Post Thence North Twenty Degrees Easter-
 ly Three hundred perches to a Black-oak Thence South
 seventy Degrees Easterly one hundred and seventy to
 a post a Corner of of William Cooper's Land Thence
 South Twenty Degrees Westerly Three hundred pches
 to the Place of Beginning
