



Surveyed to Henry Armstrong on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of August 1801 the above described tract of two hundred & fifteen acres & thirty nine perches of Land & the allowance of six per cent for roads &c. situate on the north side of Kiskiminitas river opposite the mouth of white pine run including a White oak tree marked L. M. at a large spring in the County of Armstrong: By virtue of a Warrant granted said Armstrong the 8<sup>th</sup> day of November 1784.
