



In pursuance of an Act of Assembly passed on the 12<sup>th</sup> of March 1783 for the sale of certain lands therein mentioned and by virtue of a Commission to me directed under the hand and Seal of Office of John Lukens Esquire Surveyor General for the State of Pennsylvania bearing date at Philadelphia the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1783 the above Tract of land, Containing two hundred acres and the allowance of Six Per Cent for roads &c.<sup>o</sup> was surveyed on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of June 1785 by
