Sir, the above is a Copy of a Survey as found in my Office. Recorded by Alexander McClean Esquire then Deputy Surveyor, 'tis discovered that 254 perches by 150 perches makes but 239¹/₂ 95¹/₂ & all, if this Survey is returned agreeably to this Copy 'tis evidently wrong & a mistake of Col. McClean — A Patent is wanted for this tract and another in one patent, and least a mistake might happen in patenting I think 'tis proper to give this information, if the mistake does exist as I expect in the return, ^{in your Office} would it not be right to direct it to be resurveyed so that this Survey receives its Distances correctly before 'tis coupled in patenting with the other. I shall be glad of your directions on this affair & am Sir your Obedient Servant
