



Situate on the waters of Redstone Creek on the West side of Laurel Hill in Union & George Townships Fayette County (formerly Cumberland County) is part of a Survey made by me for Edward Brownfield on the 26th day of September 1769 containing 250 1/2 Acres & allowance - who afterward sold one hundred Acres and allowance of the same, to Robert Brownfield his Brother - who sold the same to Leonard White (now deceased) Father of the said John White - the other heirs of the said Leonard have released to John White the present possessor of the hundred acres - which releases with a Covenant "accompanying the same" Between Stephen Mackey and John White, together with my statement of the cause, under the return of the Survey of the other part - made in March 1802 will lead you more readily into the nature and design of the present.
