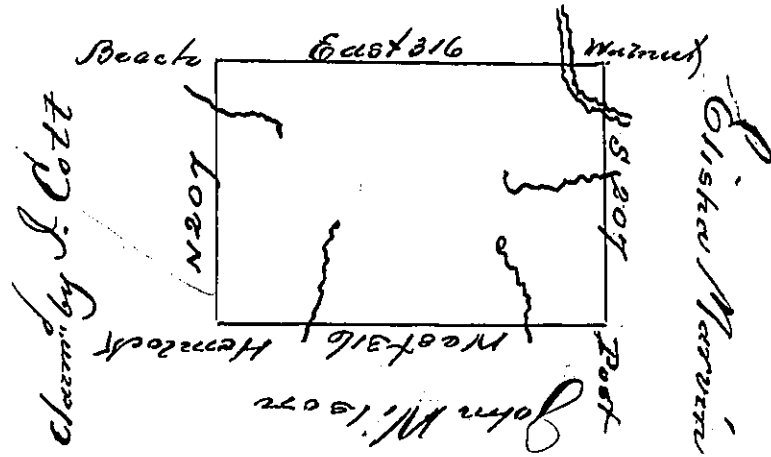


Population
