

Pursuant to a warrant from the Proprietors Commissioned, dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February 1772. I have surveyed unto William Bailey the 2<sup>d</sup> day of March ensuing the tract of Land therein described, Beginning at a <sup>mark'd</sup> Black oak Tree, Being a corner of Isaac Baileys Land thence south eighty five degrees west by land of John Jackson 45 p.m. to a post, thence by other hand of the Sr. Wm Bailey north two degrees forty five minutes West 202 p.m. to a post, thence by hand of Isaac Bailey south seventy two degrees east 48 p.m. to a corner stone thence by a line of Ancient and new mark'd trees south two Degrees forty five minutes East 183 p.m. to the place of Beginning. Containing fifty <sup>one</sup> <sup>812 p</sup> acres and the usual allowance for Roads, or fifty four acres and twenty two perches. Neat Measure
