



Note: The same survey has been already returned on a Warrant in 44. Name of Francis H. Anderson, dated May 5th 1786. each dispartent is 1/3 upon a return. Anderson obtained a patent in Sept. 1786 by purchase. Now by Judgment of Pa. Dy. of 20th Nov. 88. Patent also for Philip Black.

A Draught of Survey called "Blackwood" lying on the Waters of Pidgeon Cr. in Washington County, cont^g 224 1/2 Ac^o with the usual allow^{ce} for Roads &c. executed July 5th 1786 in Pursuance of a Certif^o for 400 Ac^o granted to Phillip Black by the Commiss^o appointed by Virg^a to adjust the Claims to unpatented Lands in the Counties Monong^a York^a & Ohio, and duly entered with the County Surv^r as appears from the List of Entries transmitted from the Surv^r Gen^ls Office.
