



Surveyed April 26th 1831 in pursuance of a Warrant granted Alexander Burns bearing date the 6th day of December 1830 containing (exclusive of the interference with David Ruple's survey designated by dotted lines) 119 Acres and the usual allowance and inclusive of said interference 146 Acres and 80 perches situate on Crabapple a branch of Wheeling creek in Richhill township in the County of Greene

The land lying within the dotted lines is part of the survey of David Ruple made the 25th day of April 1831 Both parties say that they will contend for the land before the Board of Property
