


Situate on the road from Somerset to Cumberland, on the waters of Coxes Creek, in Somerset township Somerset County (including his improvement, first begun the the 1<sup>st</sup> March 1810. at which time an actual settlement; & grain has been frequently raised thereon, & the said settlement has been continued ever since) And Surveyed the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February 1813 by John M. Clean Esquire, late deputy surveyor. In Pursuance of a Warrant granted to Richard Brown for 400<sup>o</sup> dated the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February 1813, as appears by his Official draught thereof remaining in my Office. - Certified & returned the 9<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818.
