A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in the Long Swamp Township in the County of Berks and Province of Pennsylvania Containing Sixty five acres and 132 perches of Land—or Sixty two acres and 16 Perches of Land together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads.— Being part of a Tract of 108 as 146 perches and the usual allowance for Roads—That Was Surveyed to Samuel Burger in pursuance of a Warrant granted to him by the Hone Proprietaries Dated on the 18th November Anno 1744, who by his agreement Conveyed the above to his Son in Law Jacob Long—for whom it was now partly divided and now drawn on the 24th february 1769, the Remainder was by the said Samuel Burger unto Philip Basters—Divided as above pr David Shultze.
