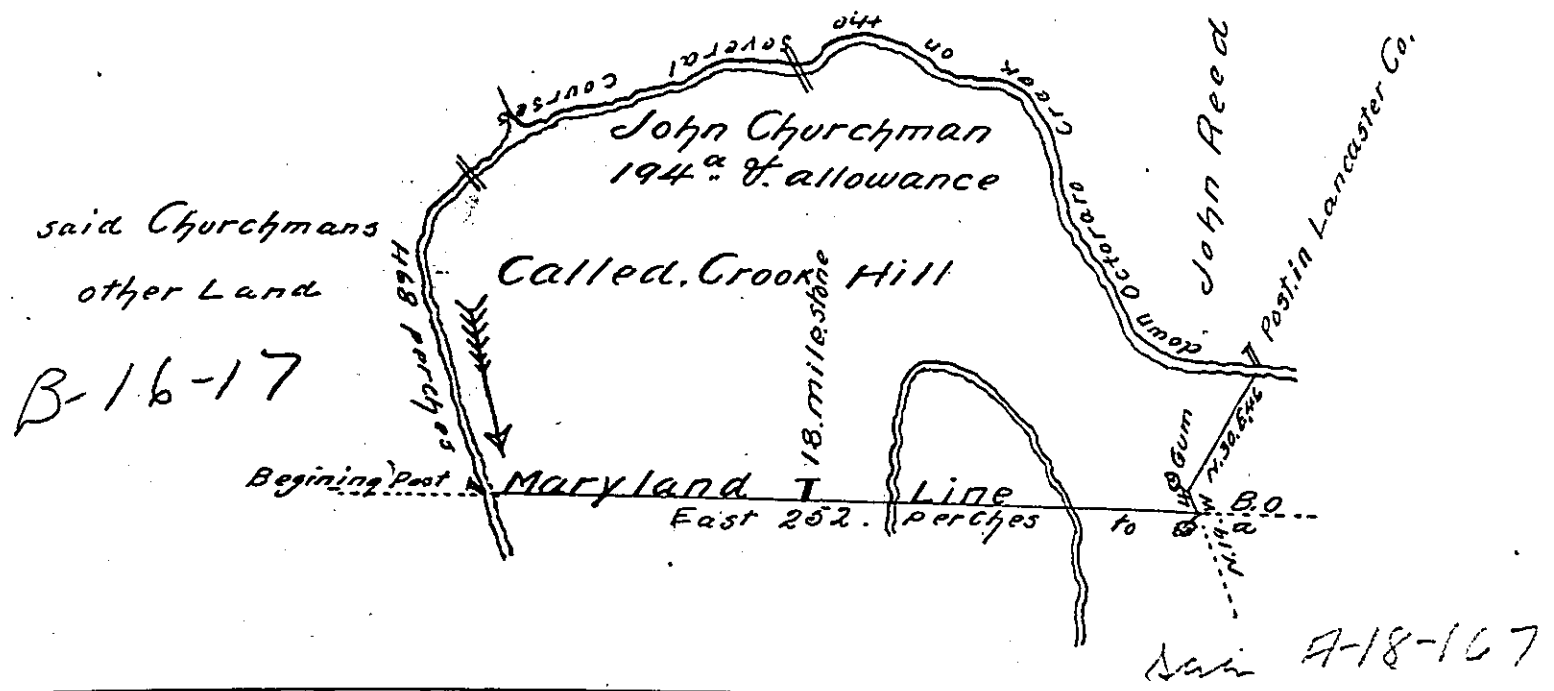


Lancaster County
Land of John Stone



By Virtue of a Warrant bearing date the 29th day of June 1786 Surveyed to John Churchman the Tract of Land above described Beginning at a post on the West side of Octoraro Creek standing in the Line of Maryland & at the corner of Lancaster County & running thence East two hundred & fifty two perches to a Black Oak thence North nineteen degrees West four perches to a Gum thence North thirty degrees East forty six perches to a post on the North side of Octoraro & in the County of Lancaster thence down the Lancaster County side of Octoraro Creek (which is the line of Chester County also) on the several courses thereof four hundred & sixty eight perches to the beginning Containing one hundred & ninety four acres of Land besides the allowance of six p Cent. the greatest part of which is situate in the County of Chester Surveyed & Certified p
