By Virtue of a Warrant granted to Andrew Cockender for dated  
 the 2d day of December 1736 there was Surveyed to him by Thos  
 Lightfoot (then Deputy Surveyor) on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1737  
 the above Described Tract of Land Containing in the whole  
 one hundred and Sixty five Acres & the 11<sup>th</sup>, and at the  
 same time Divided the same Situate in Tulpehocken Towns  
 p. in the County of Berks And at the request of Christopher  
 Winder, and by Virtue of the same Warrant I have Resurveyed  
 the above Described Tract of Land (it being part of the above  
 sd 165 Acres) on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of April 1795 According to the  
 old Marked Lines, Containing One hundred and twelve Acres  
 and thirty Perches and the All o. of Six P Cent for Roads &c  
 To Daniel Brodhead Esq: }
