



The above is a draught of a tract of land surveyed March 1<sup>st</sup> 1817, in pursuance of a warrant granted to Ebenezer Cochran dated February 18<sup>th</sup> 1785\* situate on the waters of Racoona creek, Hanover Township, Washington county. Containing one hundred and thirty three acres and eighty perches, with the usual allowance of 6 per cent &c.

\* and an order of the Board of Property dated 16<sup>th</sup> Sept<sup>r</sup> 1794 to exclude an interference in the original Survey with the Survey made to Ab<sup>m</sup> Kirkpatrick.

N.B. At the time of survey there was no house, nor family residing on the land, there had been about ten acres cleared in the summer of 1816 - I know of no adverse claim whatsoever — James Reed D.S.
