



The above is a draught of a tract of land called the Gun, which was surveyed in pursuance of a warrant granted to Josiah Crawford dated February 22^d 1815 for eight acres, situate in Straban township, on the waters of Chartiers creek in W. Co. Containing seven acres and one hundred and eleven perches, and allowance of six per cent — Executed March 23^d 1815 —

Mr. Crawfords claim to the above survey is disputed by a Mr. W^m Alley, who has built a Cabbin on the land, and has held possession since before the granting of the warrant to said Crawford

Mr. Crawfords claim appears to be founded on the following facts viz. That he the said Crawford had purchased the right of a certain John Allison, who made a settlement on the land about thirteen years ago; had built a Cabbin and cleared about two acres, and raised grain thereon, and occupied the improvement about three years. The Cabbin raised by Allison has been removed for several years and said Crawford continued to raise grain and occupy the land as his own.

These facts, with respect to Mr. Crawfords claim, have all been confirmed by Oath — I herewith enclose you a Caveat at the request of Mr. Penticost who is acting attorney-said Alley
