Henry Ebbert one of the heirs of Michael Ebbert Decd, Applies for a Patent for the above tract of land, for the use of the heirs of the said Michael Ebbert, Decd It being part of a tract of land Surveyed Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> 1784 to John Boyd By virtue of his Warrant dated July 1<sup>st</sup> 1784 By W<sup>m</sup> Montgomery D.S. and the said John Boyd by Deed Poll conveyed the same to Reuben Haines, who<sup>s</sup> Executors conveyed the same unto—Hartshorn, who by Indenture dated October 30<sup>th</sup> 1809 sold the same to William Girton, and the said William Girton with Catherine his wife by their Indenture dated April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1815 subject to the payment of the Patenting fees due to the commonwealth for the consideration therein contained did grant and confirm the same unto the said Michael Ebbert and to his heirs & assigns forever.
