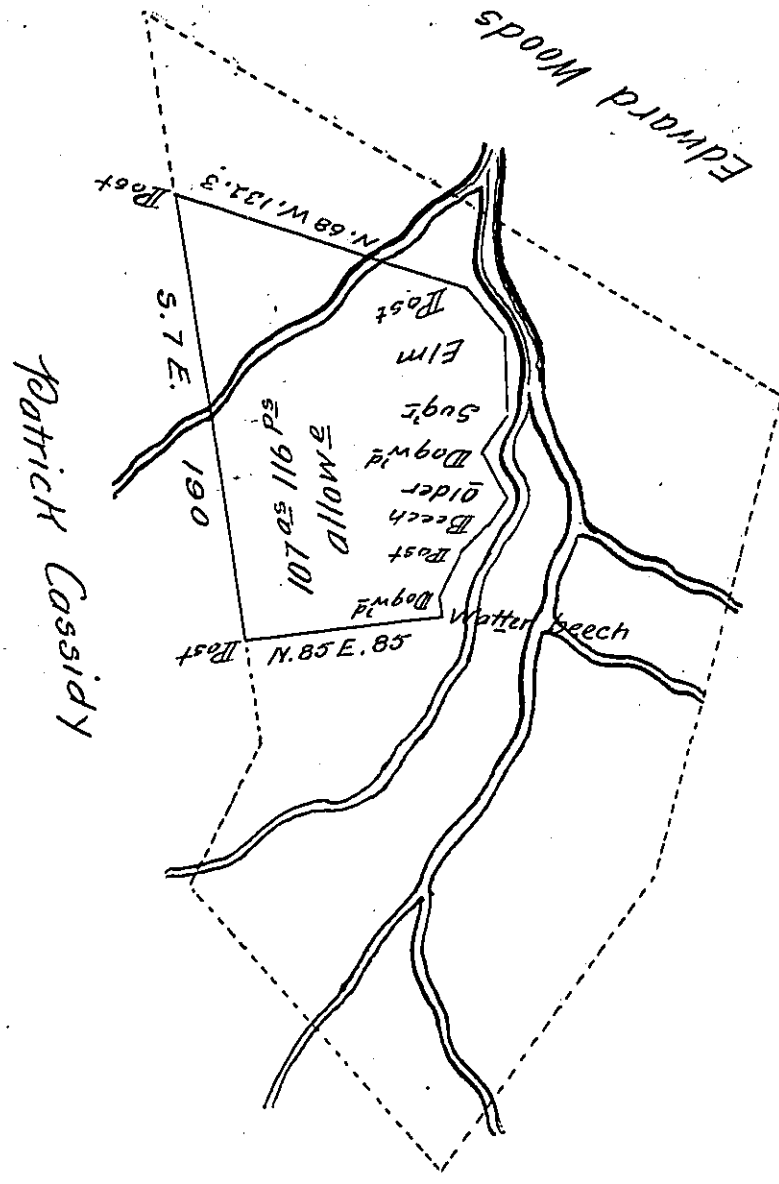

No 31. & resurveyed by order of the Board of Property dated the 23<sup>d</sup> Oct<sup>r</sup> 1802, it then contained 442 acres 13 ps & allow<sup>e</sup> &c. — This part resurveyed and divided from the residue of said tract the 30<sup>th</sup> April 1821. the dotted lines representing the original survey of Archibald McElroy
