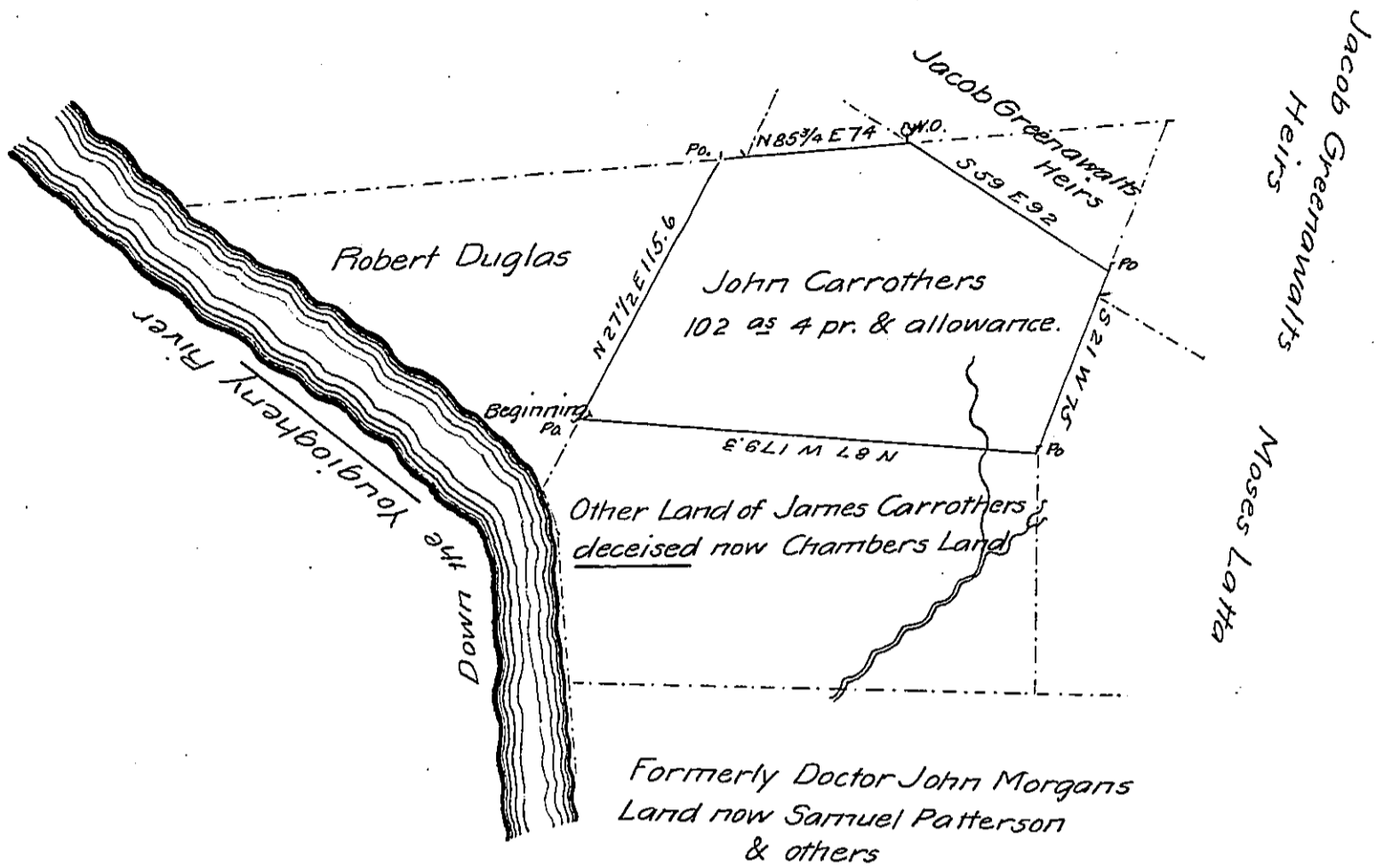


Formerly John Dorseus Land

At the request of Mrs. Elizabeth Carrothers (the Widow of James Carrothers dec'd) I surveyed the above described one hundred two acres and four perches and the usual allowance (in trust for her son John Carrothers a minor son of said James Carrothers dec'd (Being a part of the real estate of said James dec'd taken by Samuel Carrothers the Gardian of the said John at the valuation and appraisement for him the sd John Carrothers, subject to the intestate laws of Penn^a) and a part of a larger tract of land containing 303 1/4 ac 24 pr. & all. which was surveyed in pursuance of an Order N^o 1077 dated 3^d April 1769 for John McPherson Situate on the Youghiogheny River now in Massisnawa township & County of Westmoreland
