



The Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in West Pennsborough Township Cumberland County Containing Eighty one Acres and 36 perches and allowance of Six pCent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 6th. Day of October 1785 In Pursuance of the Honourable the Proprietaries Warrant Granted to Arthur Clark bearing Date at Philada. the 27th. Day of October 1750.

N. B. It appears by the Testimony of Alexander M^c Bride and James Irwin who came upon the 20th. Instant, and shewed the Line N 83 1/2° W 79 perches that, that Line was formerly Run for Arthur Clark by Col^l John Armstrong; the marked Spanish Oak which appears near the Middle, being Bl^lcked it appears to have been marked about thirty five years ago; this together with another marked Black Oak on the Same line seems to appear to be the Old line Run for Arthur Clark which line Interfers with Alexander M^c Donnell's survey and takes 12 acres & 24 perches and allowance off it as appears in the above Draught by the Doted lines Runing through it.
