



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the Second Day of February Anno Dom 1737.

The above Described tract of Land was Surveyed unto Thomas Doyle in the Township of Manheim in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Post at a Corner of the Land of John Moyer. Thence North by East by the Same 219 perches to a Post. Thence North 88 Degrees East by Caspar's Wartman's Settlement 31 perches to a Hickery. Thence North 4 perches by the Same Land to a Hickery. Thence North 88 Degrees East by the Same 76 perches to a Hickery. Thence South South West by the Land of Martin Moyer 34 perches to a Black Oak. Thence East South East by the same 62 perches to a Hickery. Thence South 17 Degrees West by the Land of Samuel Bethel 90 perches to a Hickery. Thence South South East by the Same 116 perches to a Black Oak. Thence West by North 32 perches to a Post. Thence West North West by the Land of Michael Moyer 110 perches to a Black Oak. Thence South 40 Degr West by the Same 54 perches to a Black Oak. Thence West North West 48 perches to y^e place of Beginning containing Two Hundred Acres Besides y^e Allowance of Six p Cent for Roads.
