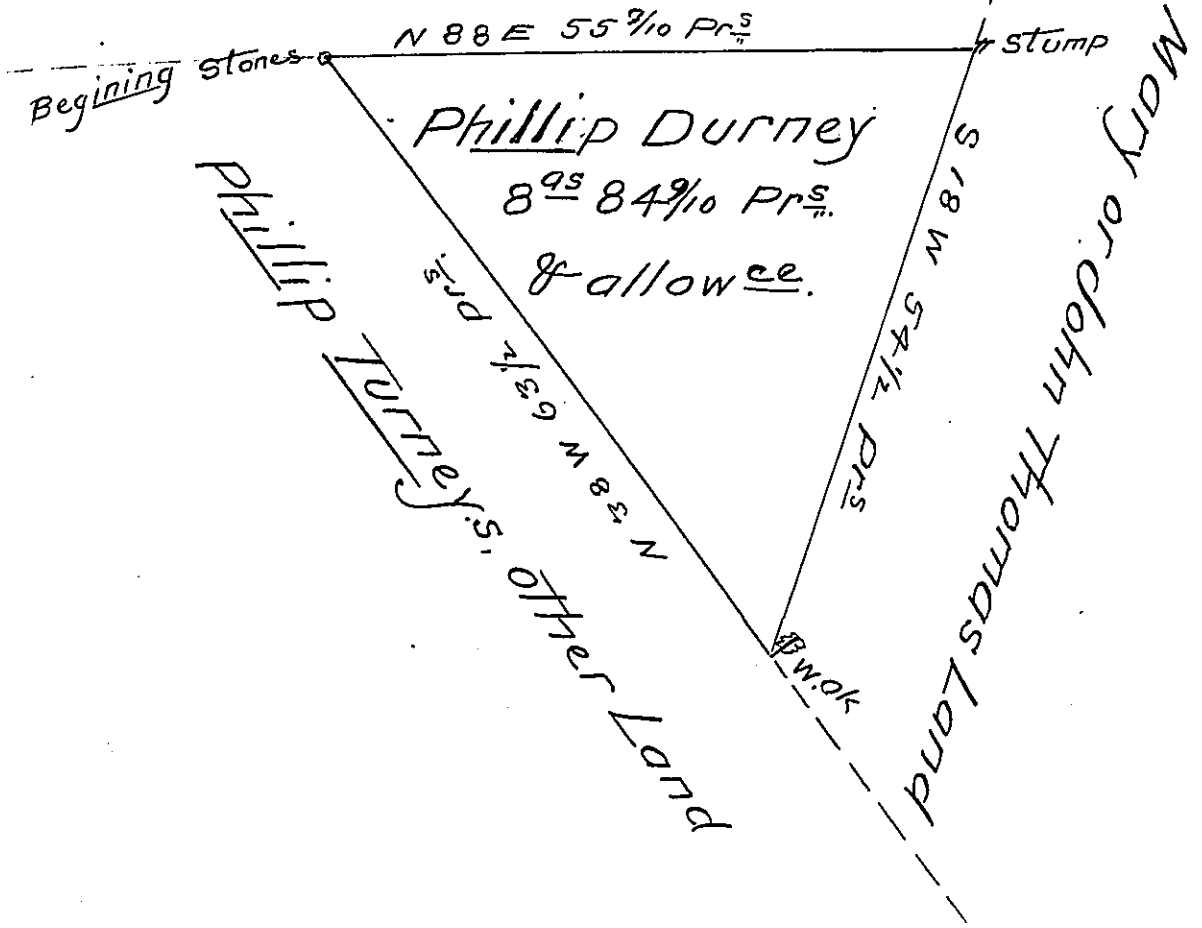


Isaac Millers heirs Land



IN PURSUANCE of a warrant granted to Philip Durney Bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> day of April A.D. 1813 Surveyed on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June following the above discribed tract of land containing Eight acres and eighty four & nine tenth perches & allowance proportioned at Six per Cent. including his improvement thereon situate in Hempfield township in the ~~Coun~~ County of Westmoreland

N.B. The above discribed tract of land includes an improvement consisting of a dwelling & about one acre of land cleared & fenced, aparantly first commenced to be improved in the year 1808 and Phillip Durney was actually residing on the land at the time of surveying the same J.M.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty sixth day of July 1904
