



By Virtue of an Order of the Surveyor General dated the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 1796, and in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of August 1773 there was surveyed on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of November 1796 unto Jonathan Evans a certain tract of Land containing 358<sup>1/2</sup> 154<sup>1/2</sup> allowance situate on some small branches of Little Fishing Creek then in Northumberland County but now in Mountpleasant Township Columbia County by William Montgomery D.S. - and now to wit on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of December 1823, by virtue of an Order of Resurvey dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of December 1823. Resurveyed, and find the Contents to be 321<sup>1/2</sup> 24<sup>1/2</sup> allowance after deducting the interferences by
