



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietarys Dated the first Day of Nov^r Anno Domⁱ 1735 There es surveyd unto Alexand-Frazier-Two hundred acres of Land with allowance of six p-Cent in Lancaster County on the west side of -Susquehannaⁿ River and Begins at a white Oak a Corner of Robt Lewiss Land Thence South fifteen Degrees westerly Two hundred and Thirty pches to a post Then North Seventy Six Degrees westerly One hundred and sixty five pches to a maple. Then North fourteen Degrees Easterly fifty Nine pches to a Black-Oak Then North East one hundred ^{perches} to a hickery Then Then North fifteen Degrees East forty Eight pches to a Post Thence South Seventy Six Degrees Easterly one hundred and Twenty perches to the place of Beginning Surveyd Nov^r 12th /1735
