 By Order of Survey No. 2269 dated April 3d. 1769 — By Moses McClean
 But their being a long and narrow Strip of Vacancy left by Consentable Lines
 I have altered the survey by Consent and no impediment in the way of
 patenting: Unless ^{that I know of} ~~A~~ Caveat be entered by Hugh Laughlin Esq! who claims a
 small part of it, and has caused a Survey to be made agreeable to his Claim
 Notwithstanding this Survey, except the Addition above mentioned, which
 does not interfere with his Claim was made long before he Obtained
 his Warrant.
