



SITUATE on the north side of Saltlick Creek in Saltlick township Fayette County and surveyed the 20th day of May 1834 in Pursuance of a Warrant in the name of Clifford Elder for 150 acres of improved land dated the 30th day of May 1832, there is on this tract about 20 acres of cleared land, an old cabbin not now occupied, and a schoolhouse; the improvement appears to be 20 or 25 years old.

Note - as the papers relating to some of the adjoiners could not be had, and the timber is much destroyed in some places, it is not entirely certain that we have run upon all the old lines of Binks Haines & Herholdt; it is believed that the line of Haines from near the poplar, is more correctly represented by the dotted line; but, as all the land now belongs to one person ^{as} he is satisfied with the lines as above. I return them as they are. The old lines marks of Binks and Haines are mostly destroyed.
