



A Draught of A Tract of Land Situate on the Waters of Black Hole Creek, Adjoining Land Settled by Parsons, & Joining Lands of Reuben Hains & others, in Washington Township Formerly White Deer, in the County of Northumberland, Survey'd on the 20th day of June 1788, for James Gibson in Pursuance of his Warrant bearing date the 9th day of September 1784, Containing Three Hundred & nine Acres with the Allowance of Six P Cent for Roads & C.

N.B. The Figure A. Represents a Tract of Land Survey'd & Return'd to Samuel Reese in Pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 24th day of May 1785, & Containing 218 Acres with Allowance & C. The Figure B. Likewise Represents Part of A Survey Return'd to Jeremiah Reese made in Pursuance of his Warrant Dated the 2'd day of September 1785, & Containing Ninety One Acres with Allowance & C. Both these Surveys were made A Considerable time before James Gibsons Warrant Came into my Hands. Otherwise it would of had the Preferance as its much Earlier & C. Equally well Located & C.
