



In pursuance of a Warrant Dated the fourth Day of June 1734. I have Surveyed to David George a tract of Land Situate on the West side of Schuylkill within the Liberties of the City of Philadelphia Appurtenant to the Original Purchase of 625 Acres made by Randell Vernon of the late Proprietary William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup>. Beginning at a post near (obl.) small Hickery marked in a line of Land of William Couch thence by the same N 71 1/2° W 11 1/2 perches to a post. & N 19 1/2° E 42 perches to a stone. thence by Hugh Thomas's Land N 69° 45' W 14.3 to a Post. thence by Vacant Land S 19 1/2° W 42.4 p<sup>s</sup> to a post. & N 71 1/2° W 4.8 to a post. thence by other Land of the said David George S 19 1/2° W 32.6 to a post S 71 1/2° E 30.6 to a post. & N 19 1/2° E 32.6 to the place of Beginning Containing Ten Acres. Surveyed 25<sup>th</sup> August 1751.
