



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{orable} Proprietaries bearing date the eighth day of April Anno Di 1738

I have surveyed and Laid out unto William Ernack in the Township of Pensborough in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna River one hundred and seventy eight acres of land with allowance of Six P. Cent. Beginning at a Post by Yellow-Britches Creek thence North eighty five degrees Easterly one hundred and forty Pches to a white oak thence north five degrees westerly ninety two perches to a black oak thence north forty one degrees westerly thirty perches to a Beech by the said Creek then up the same traversing the severall courses thereof about — Perches to the Beginning
