



Situate in Dover township in the County of York Containing as above set forth  $29\frac{1}{4}$  <sup>ac.</sup> of allowance being part of a larger tract of  $126\frac{2}{3}$  <sup>ac.</sup> of 100 perches and allowance which was originally surveyed by George Smith D.S. under Thomas Cookson late D.S. on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March 1744 in pursuance of a Warrant for  $50\frac{2}{3}$  <sup>ac.</sup> granted to Lawrence Greer dated the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of February 1742. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tract the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December A.D. 1812 at the request of the present owner John Knisely who desired the same to be returned for Confirmation
