



The above described tract of one hundred and two acres & seventy one perches, of land & allowance, is part of a larger tract of two hundred and twenty one acres, one hundred & sixty three perches, & allowance, situate in Peters Township (formerly Hopewell) Franklin County (formerly Lancaster) which was surveyed to William Gardner the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1706 in pursuance of his warrant, dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>y</sup> 1742 by Daniel Henderson, Esq<sup>e</sup> late Dep<sup>t</sup> Surveyor - Resurveyed and divided off the 24<sup>th</sup> day of December 1806.
