



Situate in Faxon Township in the County of York that part included within the Yellow lines in the above Draught, where the letter A. is placed, containing as above set forth 46.25 & 18 perches & allowance. Represents part of a larger tract of 138 1/2 Acres & allowance, which was originally surveyed by John Churchman on the 30th day of the 8th mo 1744 for William Graydon by virtue of a Warrant, dated November 2^d A.D. 1741, 1746. Represent parts of a larger Tract of 314 1/2 & 50 perches & allowance, which was originally surveyed by William Matthews, late S.D. on the 22^d day of the 10th Month 1765, for Henry Cowgill Assignee of Matthew Payne. In pursuance of a Warrant for 150⁰ dated the 20th day of March, 1758, B within the Red lines containing 40.25 & 110 perches & allowance and C. containing 15.25 & 30 perches and allowance within the Blue lines. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tracts of Land the 9th day of April, 1799, and now at the request of James Wiley in Trust as Tenant, by the Courtesy of Elizabeth Wiley his Daughter who is yet a minor the above has been calculated & examined and corrected the 26th day of March A.D. 1810, & who desired the same to be returned for Confirmation
