



On the 8<sup>th</sup> of May 1751, a warrant issued in favor of Benjamin Gass for 150 acres of Land & a survey made by James Cunningham, Assistant to John Armstrong Esq<sup>r</sup> D.S. (the draft of which is now in his office) appears to have been made in pursuance of that warrant and which survey includes all the land described in the above diagram, but on the 9<sup>th</sup> June 1789, a survey was made by Matt<sup>r</sup> Henderson Esq<sup>r</sup> late D.S. at the instance by direction of Wm Gass one of the heirs of Benjamin Gass aforesaid which is represented by the dotted lines at the east end of the above & was return'd as 212 3/4 acres on the warrant aforesaid, from the section of the west end under the black lines (which was the part of another heir) and from a small difference between the last & first survey on the east end, it is probable that the last said party had no knowledge of the said original survey which thus fairly includes both Tracts - and the western division within the black lines is reserved as a part of the original survey on the warrant of 8<sup>th</sup> May, 1751 found to contain one hundred & nine acres, 102 perches & the allowance of six p. cent. this 3<sup>rd</sup> December, 1799, it is in Guilford Township in the County of Franklin.
