By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the ninth day of July 1734. Surveyed unto Jacob Hudleston a tract of Land situate at Maxatawny in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a Black Oak a corner of his other land thence by the same south eighty degrees West ninety four perches to a post, thence by land of Christopher Minasmit south ten degrees East one hundred perches to a post, thence by Vacant land North Eighty degrees East one hundred and fifty one perches to a post, thence by Vac<sup>t</sup> Land North ten degrees West one hundred and thirty three perches to a post in a line of Casper Winters land thence by the same south eighty degrees west fifty seven perches to a post, thence by other land of said Hudleston south ten degrees East thirty three perches to the place of Beginning, containing one hundred acres with y<sup>e</sup> usual allowance of said p<sup>o</sup> Cent, Surveyed Sept<sup>r</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> 1734.
