



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the twenty first day of April, 1794 granted to George Graul was surveyed on the twentieth day of January A.D. 1817. The above described tract of land containing 400 acres — ~~perches~~ and allowance of six per cent for roads, &c. situated in Venango township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, John Clawson was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of thirty (obl.)es of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided as above stated, between Joseph Clark and said John Clawson.
