



From Papers in Deputy's Surveyor's Office of Lycoming County it appears that the above Discribed tract of Land was Survey'd on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of November 1792 By J.J. Wallace the then D.S. to John Weigle by Virtue of a Warrant granted to Joseph Hill the 29<sup>th</sup> Oct<sup>r</sup> 1792. And at the Request of the present owner Joseph Hill Survey'd this 25<sup>th</sup> day January 1816. Containing one hundred & Ninety four Acres & twenty Six perches and allowance of Six per cent for Roads &c. Situate in Manoland (formerly Muncy) Township Lycoming County & bounded as above Discribed
