



Situate in Warrington Township in the County of York Containing as above set forth thirty Acres, twenty perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c^e Being part of a larger tract of 228^{ac} & allowance. Originally Surveyed by George Stevenson Esq^r. late D.S. on the 4th day of January A.D. 1755, in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Christopher Hussey dated the 6th day of June A.D. 1748. The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract on the 9th day of September A.D. 1811, and now at the request of George Lenhart the present owner of said part, the Draught is examined, found correct and returned for confirmation. January 11th 1822.
