



By virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing Date the Ninth Day of February Anno 1739. I have Survey'd and Laid out unto John Curle on a branch of Conewaga Creek in the County of Lancaster on the west Side Susquehanna ri<sup>ver</sup> in right of Nicholas Curle one hundred & fifty four Acres of Land with Allowance of Six P Cent Beginning at <sup>(a)</sup> poplar Tree thence South twenty four Degrees Westerly fift<sup>(b)</sup> ft Pches and an half to Gum Tree thence South Ten Degrees Westerly one hundred and two Pches to a Maple tree Thence North Sixty Six Degrees westerly one hundred Eighty four Pches to a Hickery Thence North forty two Degrees Easterly one hundred fifty Seven Pches to a Hickery Thence South Sixty Six Degrees Easterly one hundred fifty Nine Pches to the Place of Beginning
