Situate in Porter Township Huntingdon County Containing One Hundred Eighty seven Acres Ninety two perches and the usual allowance. Surveyed Dec. 27th 1837 on an order of Survey dated Dec. 12th 1837 Which issued in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Arthur Foster for one hundred acres dated June 5th 1755 which called for adjoining Land, then lately surveyed to George Croghan and situate at the far Crossings of Juniata.
