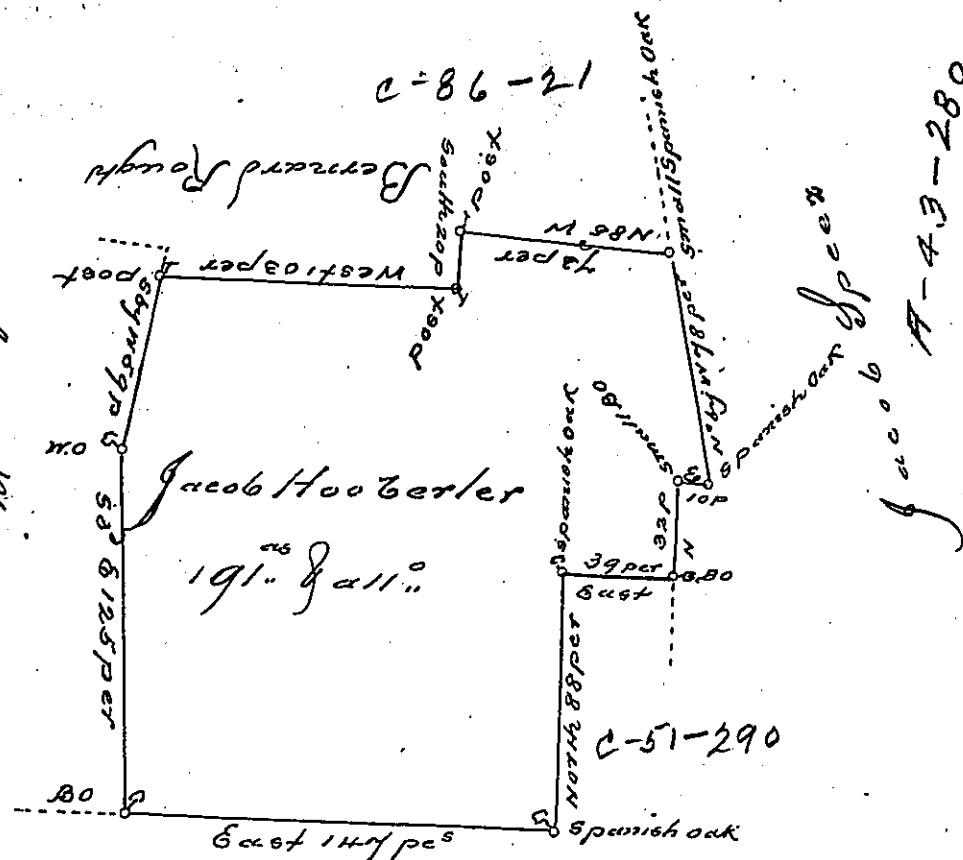

By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Domini 1739. The above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed to Jacob Hoerberler in Tulpehocken Township and Lancaster County. Beginning at a Black Oak in the line of Jacob Speer. Thence North by the same 32 ps. to a Small Black Oak. Thence east by the S. Speer 10 ps. to a Spanish Oak &c. Containing One Hundred & ninety one acres beside 1/2<sup>nd</sup> of 6/8 Cent & 1/2<sup>nd</sup> of 11<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup>
