



Surveyed on the Twenty second day of March 1733 To Andreas Hauke,  
 a Tract of Land situated in the Township of Salford in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>  
 Beginning at a Hickery Tree to the right a corner of Christopher Hank-  
 abrants land thence by y<sup>e</sup> same North west two hundred & twenty six  
 perches to a Hickery Sapling another corner of y<sup>e</sup> S. Hankabrants land,  
 thence by Vacant land North East one hundred & fifty perches to a  
 white Oak mark for a corner, thence by Vacant land East 6 & 1/2  
 South East two hundred & twenty six perches to a post, thence by  
 Vacant land and land of Derick Johnson South west one hundred  
 & fifty perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning containing two hundred  
 acres with usual allowances
