



Thomas Hutton's Lot contains in breadth on Front Street 39 ft. a part thereof in breadth 22 ft. is part of a lot of 100 ft. broad formerly of Thomas Budd by the residuary breadth of 17 feet is part of a 20 ft. lot, formerly laid out in right of James Boyden's purchase, Thomas Hutton's Lot is now bounded Eastw. by Delaware Front St., Southw. by part of a lot formerly of Thomas Budd, Westw. by a 30 ft.
