By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 29th day of March Anno Domini 1734. Surveyed on the 4th day of August Anno Domini 1739. to James Anderson a Tract of Land Situate in the Township of Donegal, in the County of Lancaster, Beginning at a post in the line of John Wilkin's land, thence North 8 deg. West 134 per to a Black Oak, thence South 81 deg. West 250 per to a Black Oak, thence South 67 per to a Black Oak, thence West by South 33 per to a Hicory, thence South 67 per to a Hicory, thence East 223 per to a Black Oak, thence North 73 deg. East 78 per to the place of Beginning. Containing Two Hundred & twenty acres and the allowance of six acres per Cent for Roads & Highways
