



By Virtue of a warrant dated the 2<sup>d</sup> day of May 1792 and order of Survey rec<sup>d</sup> the 2<sup>d</sup> day of May 1846 Surveyed the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1846 To William Craig the above described Tract of land Situate adjoining the road leading from Bettis<sup>s</sup> Ferry to Shohaly House about four miles from Delaware River (formerly Upper Smithfield) now Dingman Township (formerly Northampton) now Pike County Containing Three hundred and nineteen Acres Ninety five perches and allowance of Six p<sup>r</sup> C<sup>t</sup> for roads &c.
