



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the 13<sup>th</sup> day of April 1792. granted to William Hamelton. was surveyed on the 21<sup>th</sup> day of November 1817. The above described tract of land containing 348 acres 64 perches and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. situated in Venango township Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, John Stake was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of 30 acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, ~~and that the same was divided as to have stated between~~
