



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Germantown Township in Cumberland County Containing one Hundred and three Acres and Sixty nine perches and the usual Allowance of Six Per cent for Roads; Surveyed for Thomas Holt September the 20<sup>th</sup> 1762 in pursuance of the Honourable the Proprietar<sup>cies</sup> Warrant Bearing Date 5<sup>th</sup> June 1762.

The above Warr<sup>t</sup> was located on Jacks Creek but could not be satisfied there by reason of prior Warrants granted to Epitam Blain & Henry Cunningham & is now Executed on the West Side of Brightwells Run, on the Traders Path North Side of Juniata about five miles above the mouth of <sup>Kishacoquillas</sup> ~~Mata~~ where the land was then Vacant so far as came to my knowledge
