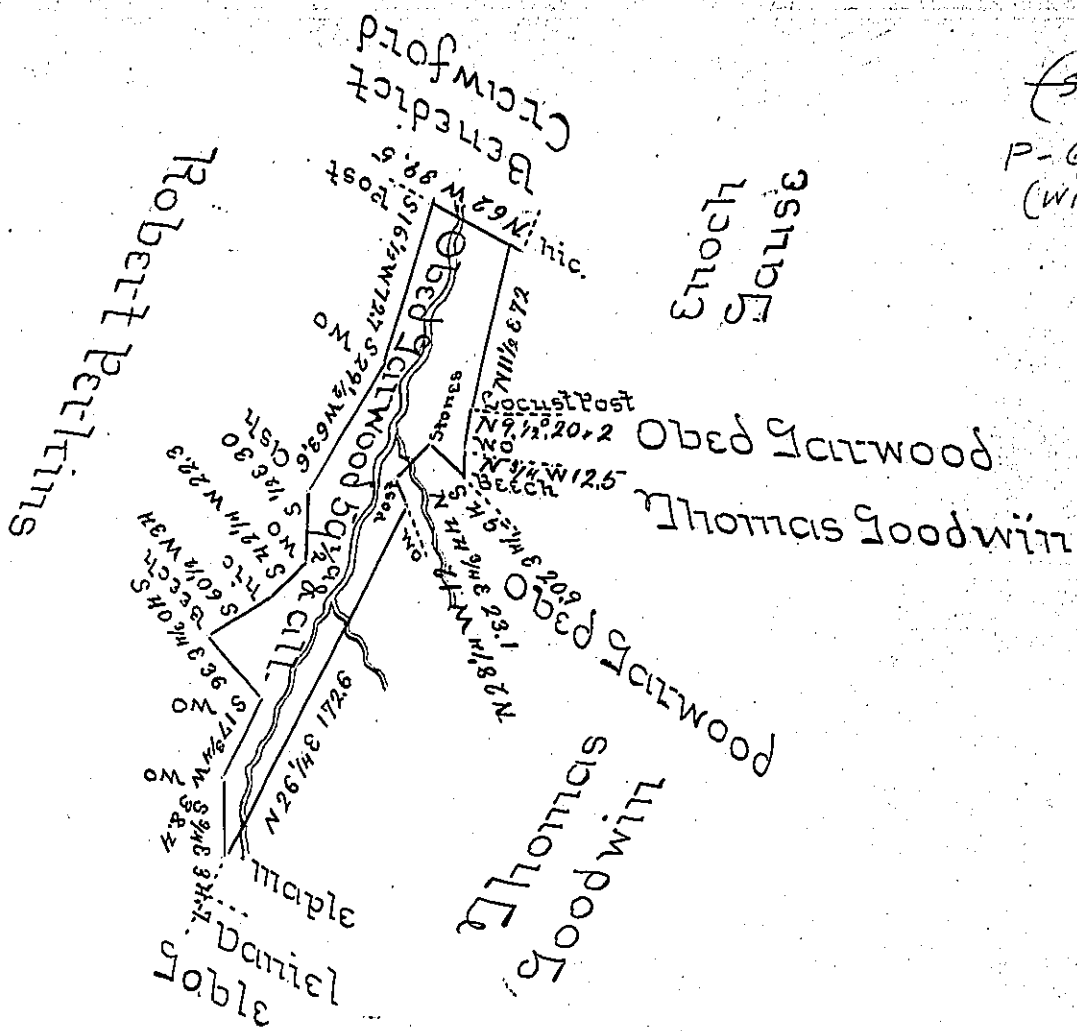

Note, Andrew Baits had procured a Warrant for 50^{ac} on the
15th Sept 1792. located on the same ground. Obed Garwood
not knowing it obtained a Warrant for the same on the
25th day of the same Month and year for 60^{ac}. Baits sold
to Garwood, who sold the same to Miley, but did not execute
a Conveyance - The Heirs of Garwood knowing the Circum-
stances released to Miley - My reason for returning the
Survey under the W^t of Garwood is - the other would not
cover it - and the land all around being surveyed is not
patented - would have left a few Acres useless to any -
