



Situate on the waters of Dumbars.
 Run in Dunbar township, Fayette County
 & Surveyed the 20th of March 1834 in pur-
 suance of a warrant in the name of

William Gun for 400^{as} dated the 30th of January 1794 - There is a few acres
 cleared, a cabbins and the family of Stewart residing on this tract at the
 time of Surveying the improvement is about 15 years old

Note - at the time this land was surveyed I had some doubts of
 the propriety of locating this warrant on this land as it calls for "George Job" and
 the land of Job being already appropriated, I could not make them adjoin each
 other and the W^t of Rob^t John on the North of this was to extend to W^m Gun
 which was prevented by the location of Benjⁿ Wells and a corner of Ge^o
 Meade as located by request of the owners - however as this land would remain
 vacant, and as I know of no adverse claim ~~other~~ to the land, and it being so
 near the same place, I have, at the request of the owner, concluded to finish
 and return it, with a hope that it may be accepted.
